Drug charges were the most frequent type of crime (23%) committed by new entries to probation in 2014, followed by driving while impaired (17%), larceny (16%), and assault (11%). The majority of parole entries during 2013 were 'Not Reported or Undefined (17%), driving while impaired (15%). Other crimes were drugs-non-trafficking (13%), burglary (8%), and assault (8%). The most frequent crime category for post-release supervision cases was drugs-non-trafficking (16%). Other crimes were breaking and entering (12%), robbery (12%) larceny (10%), assault (8%), and habitual felons (8%).
